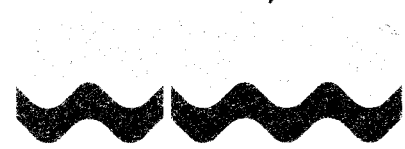

Request for directional signs, Thomas Peacocke Community College, Rye

The Traffic Management Team has received a request from Thomas Peacocke Community College for directional signs for the college to be erected around Rye. After considering different traffic management issues and investigating various possibilities, it was decided that there is only a need for one sign specifically for Thomas Peacocke Community College.

This decision was reached as the Community College is next to the swimming pool which is adequately signed around Rye. Anyone looking for the Community College will be looking for it for a specific reason and so can be told to follow the signs for the swimming pool.

After informing Thomas Peacocke Community College of our decision they have come back to us and said that they are not happy with our decision and would like to have about four signs put up at various locations around the town. Whilst we understand why they would like this, we are tentative to agree. The signs are fairly large and the installation of them may require extra posts and possibly the redesign of some of the existing sign assemblies around Rye.

We are writing to you to gain your view on this matter as we are aware of Rye Town Council and Rye Partnership not wanting sign clutter around the town.
