The youth of Rye deserve this opportunity as it would provide them with the chance to be apart of something as currently Rye doesnt offer this type of team building enviroment.

If I was given the oppurtunity to set up and run a Rye town amatuer boxing club, I would seek funding from the police (as they fund varies other clubs) cash for clubs (a community sport funding group), big lottery small grants (a community funding grants), princess trust community cash awards, sport england (a community sport funding group), sports match, innovation fund, themed funding rounds, comic relief sport for change, the tesco charity community awards scheme and so on. I would also seek sponsorship from various local businesses in return for advertisement. This funding would pay for all the equipment the club would need such as a boxing ring, punch bags, speed balls, skipping ropes etc. The boxers would then have to pay subs per session at £2.50pp and all club subs would go to a treasurer and the club would use this money to pay for the boxers medical cards, trainer developement, competitions, boxers travel, equipment maintanace and excursions for the boxers i.e club days out to places such as thorpe park, white water rafting, go-ape etc. (this is reward for their hard work and dedication and also for team bonding) I would create and enter the boxers frequently to sponsored events and would pay 50% of the sponsor money to the community centre and the remaining 50% would go to the treasurer and when required spent on the club. Once the boxers have gained a basic skill set i would take them to other local boxing clubs to train with their boxers and invite the clubs to come and train with ours, this is to socialise the boxers and of course ensure they have enough experience to represent their town in high-level competetive boxing matches. I have various other ex-boxers that are willing to dedicate themselves to developing the boxers as well as myself to which we will be doing so completely free of charge, once the club has gained some capital and the boxers are ready for competetive bouts I would use the clubs money to qualify all coaches and would affiliate the club with the ABA as a fully established competitive amatuer boxing club.

I have recently spoken to a teacher from a school in Hastings who teaches childern with behavioural diffuculties in which some of them have begun boxing and she is intending to write a statement to prove the advantages of community boxing clubs, I have also spoken to a police liason officer for schools in East Sussex and he is also intending to write a statement.

I have printed off various articles from the internet which explain how community boxing gyms have affected their communities and states the facts on how boxing clubs have cut anti-social behaviour, tackled sedentry issues that the so called playstation generation fall victim to, the influence on healthy physical life styles and so on.
